New Zealand Diploma in Enrolled Nursing (Level 5)

Learn the theory and clinical nursing practice required to apply for registration as an enrolled nurse with the Nursing Council of New Zealand with this 18-month diploma programme. Your study comprises of a combination of theory, practice in simulated environments, and clinical placements in different healthcare settings.

Practice your skills in different nursing contexts such as rehabilitation, acute care, and mental health while studying the fundamentals of nursing and the human body.

Nursing as a Profession: Enrolled Nursing To enable students to develop contemporary knowledge underpinning enrolled nursing practice.

NURS4412

Applied Social Science for Enrolled Nurses

To enable students to understand key concepts from developmental, cultural and social theories and how these influence the health of consumers, families/whanau and the community.

NURS4413

Applied Structure and Function of the Human Body

To enable students to understand and apply the basic structure and function of major body systems to enrolled nursing practice.

NURS4414

Clinical Skills for Enrolled Nursing

To enable students to safely practise skills in a simulated clinical setting under the direction of a

Registered Nurse.

NURS4415

Foundations for Enrolled Nursing Practice

To enable students to undertake clinical experience in a range of health care settings to meet entry level Nursing Council of New Zealand competencies for the enrolled nurse scope of practice.

NURS5411

Enrolled Nursing Practice: Acute Care

To enable students to demonstrate the knowledge, skills and attitudes in an acute care (medical/surgical/peri-operative) setting to meet the requirements of the Nursing Council of New Zealand competencies for the enrolled nurse scope of practice.

NURS5412

Enrolled Nursing Practice: Mental Health and Addictions

To enable students to demonstrate knowledge, skills and attitudes when working with health consumers in mental health settings to meet the requirements of the Nursing Council of New Zealand competencies for the enrolled nurse scope of practice.

NURS5413

Enrolled Nursing Practice: Rehabilitation and Community

To enable students to demonstrate knowledge, skills and attitudes to meet the requirements of the Nursing Council of New Zealand competencies for the enrolled nurse scope of practice in settings that support the principles of nursing care.

Academic Requirements

NCEA Level 2 which must include 12 credits in Level 1 Mathematics OR

New Zealand Certificate in Study and Career Preparation (Level 3) Health Pathway or equivalent

If you have undertaken examinations other than NCEA (e.g. International Baccalaureate, Cambridge Examination), we will assess your qualification for academic entry equivalency.

English Requirements

If English is not the applicant's first language, applicants will need to provide a result from a test or qualification on the acceptable alternatives English Proficiency
Outcomes Chart.

• IELTS 6.5 Academic (no lower than 6.5 in any subtest)

Note:

IELTS scores used must be taken from a single IELTS Test Report Form and are valid for two years from the date of the test.

COVID-19 vaccination requirements

Government COVID-19 vaccine mandates finished on Monday 26 September 2022, however, many placement providers will require that ākonga (students) are vaccinated against COVID-19 (up to two vaccinations and one booster), before they allow any placements to proceed. Placements are an integral part of our health programmes and ākonga must complete these practical elements to successfully achieve their qualification. We cannot, therefore, guarantee a placement without this evidence, as per our clinical placement agreements with placement providers. On acceptance into the programme, ākonga are required to complete a health screening to provide

current evidence of their immunisation status, as required by Te Puna Whai Ora | Ministry of Health and our placement providers. At this stage ākonga will also need to provide a copy of their Covid vaccination record.
